

## ***PAID STREET PARKING (REGULATED PARKING)***

### **PRIVACY POLICY PURSUANT TO ARTS. 13 AND 14 OF EU REGULATION NO. 679/2016 (GDPR)**

#### **DATA CONTROLLER AND CONTACTS**

The Data Controller is Azienda Trasporti Milanesi S.p.A. (ATM), with registered office in Foro Buonaparte 61, 20121, Milan (Italy). #### **PURPOSE OF THE PROCESSING AND LEGAL BASIS**

The purpose of the processing is the provision of parking service on a rotating basis, within the blue stripes and subject to payment of an hourly rate (as well as the fulfilment of obligations and the protection of the consequent rights). The legal basis is art. 7 of the Highway Code and the execution of the contract with the Municipality of Milan for the concession of services related and complementary to local public transport.

#### **CATEGORIES OF DATA PROCESSED AND RECIPIENTS**

Data processed are ordinary personal data. Personal data are processed by personnel authorized by the data controller and may be communicated to companies supplying goods and/or services related to the processing. An example of these is the company supplying the parking meters.

#### **METHODS OF PROCESSING AND POSSIBLE TRANSFER OF DATA**

The data are processed only for the purposes mentioned above and according to the principles of lawfulness, correctness, transparency, accuracy, integrity and confidentiality, established by the regulations in force. The personal data management may also take place through automated and computerized processes. The personal data collected will not be transferred outside the European Economic Area.

#### **DATA RETENTION PERIOD**

The data will be stored for 5 years.

#### **DATA SUBJECT RIGHTS**

All the rights of the data subject are guaranteed in accordance with the provisions of Articles 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22 and 77 of the GDPR:

- right of access to your personal data and all information on the processing carried out;
- right to rectification of inaccurate personal data and integration of incomplete data;
- right to erasure ('right to be forgotten');
- right to limit the processing of your personal data;
- right to data portability;
- right to object to the processing of your personal data;
- right not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing;
- right to lodge a complaint with the Italian Data Protection Authority in case a violation is thought to have been carried out.
